VCU/Johns Hopkins University Study of Diet and Autism

A group of researchers at Virginia Commonwealth University and Johns Hopkins University are going to test the efficacy of an experimental diet in treatment of autism spectrum disorder. The experimental diet eliminates all grains, starches, and refined sugars, all foods high in oxalate (organic acids), and all cow's milk products. The experimental diet includes red meats, pork, poultry, fish, plant oils, goat and sheep's milk products, and a wide variety of vegetables and fruits.

The researchers are looking for study participants who meet the following criteria:

The researchers are looking for study participants who meet the following criteria:

- children ages 2 to 6 who
 - O have a diagnosis of an autism spectrum disorder and
 - O live in the Richmond, VA area

You and your child's participation would involve:

- Preliminary parent interviews
- Your child following the experimental diet for up to 18 weeks (all food will be provided by the restaurant Mezzanine)
- Periodic observations of your child in your home and/or school setting
- Medical evaluations on 2 occasions each at the Child Development Clinic at the Children's Hospital of Richmond and the Clinical Research Services Laboratory at VCU, which will include questions about your child and collection of urine, stool, and blood samples.

Compensation for you and your child's participation include:

- Provision of all meals and snacks for your child during the diet period (up to 18 weeks)
- Reimbursement for travel to and from the Child Development Clinic at the Children's Hospital of Richmond and the Clinical Research Services Laboratory
