JULY 29 FREE WORKSHOP

AGE 18: SOCIAL SECURITY DISABILITY DETERMINATION, APPLYING FOR SSI & SSDI AND UNDERSTANDING SSI WORK INCENTIVES

Steve Waldron, MSW, will explain Social Security benefit rules when a child turns age 18. Included is the adult definition of disability, how & when to apply for benefits, and how the application process works. It also provides an overview of work incentives which allow Social Security beneficiaries to work and keep their cash and health insurance benefits. He will also cover SSI Work Incentives.

Steve K. Waldron has a B.A. in History-Political Science from the University of Montana and a Master of Social Work from Virginia Commonwealth University. Currently he is head of the Social Security Solutions Division of Flying Raptor Consulting. CHANGES TO MEDICAID WAIVER RESPITE

Medicaid Waiver respite supports have changed in the past couple of years-

- The annual amount of allowable respite hours was reduced from 720 hours to 480 hours (Tech Waiver limits respite is 360 hours)
- The annual 480 hours begin on July 1 and end June 30
- Respite is no longer approved/authorized for open ended periods of time.

For many people, but not all, respite expires June 30, 2013. This mostly affects people who have been receiving respite for a couple of years or more. You should have received a notice from DMAS back when your last respite was authorized and that notice will have an end date for services. If you continue to need respite after June 30 and you do not have a copy of your DMAS notice with an end date for respite you can verify that your respite will continue. People who use DD, ID or Tech Waiver respite can contact their case manager or support coordinator to verify that their respite will continue and the date the service will expire. People who use EDCD Waiver respite can verify this with their services facilitator or respite agency.

NEW Update on Individual and Family Support Program

Funding for the Individual and Family Support Program (IFSP) for fiscal year ending June 30, 2013 has been exhausted. New funding will be available by late summer or early fall.

With the new funding cycle, a new online application will be rolled out. Applications will be taken online or by mail; faxed applications will no longer be accepted.

Individual and Family Support Program funds may be provided to individuals or family members in varying amounts, as requested and approved by DBHDS, up to the established annual maximum individual financial support limit per fiscal year. The fiscal year 2014 (i.e., through 6/30/14) limit is \$3,000.

The IFSP is designed to assist individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities on the waiting list for the ID or DD Waiver (and their families) to access short-term person/family-centered resources, supports, and services.
