
## Into the Light

#### VDOE RELEASES DECEMBER 2016 CHILDCOUNT NUMBERS

According to the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE), as of December 1, 2016, over 19,500 students, ages 4-21, in public schools in Virginia were identified as having a primary IEP diagnosis of autism. The VDOE numbers do not include young children not yet identified, individuals in private schools, or adults on the autism spectrum. As the prevalence rate of autism has continued to increase over the past 10 years, so has the number of students with a primary diagnosis of autism in Virginia's public schools. According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the prevalence rate of autism was 1 in 150 individuals in 2007, and 10 years later it is reported that 1 in 68 children is on the autism spectrum, a 120% increase. Virginia public schools have seen an increase of 158% in autism prevalence from 2007-2017.

Theories vary on the cause for this increase in numbers, but what is known is that more and more individuals are living with autism today. Thus, there is an even greater need for appropriate services and supports in order for individuals to be able to lead independent and self-sustaining lives. The Autism Society Central VA continues to share this and similar information in an effort to educate all who live in our community about the need for increased services and supports so that all individuals living with autism can lead a life full of dignity, value, and respect.

#### What do the Numbers Really Mean?

As mentioned in our front page article this month, according to the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) December 1, 2016 Childcount figures, over 19,500 students, ages 4-21, in public schools in Virginia are identified as having a primary IEP diagnosis of autism. Here's how that number breaks down in our local community:

ASCV data also reflects an increase in the need for services and supports and too many individuals on waiting lists for assessment/diagnosis, therapy services, and Medicaid waivers. As the number of individuals identified in our community continues to increase, so too does the need for increased advocacy, education, information and referral, support, and community. These are the 5 Core Services the ASCV provides to maintain and increase the quality of live for everyone affected by autism, which includes individuals on the spectrum, at any age and any stage, and all who support them. We are a small but mighty team dedicated to improving the lives of ALL living with autism in our community. We believe that each person with autism is deserving of a life in a community where they can pursue options to maximize their quality of life, and we continuously advocate for that goal.

Here are just a few recent numbers that are meaningful to us!

From January to April, 2017, the ASCV:

- Responded to over 800 requests for Information and Referral (inquiries by email and phone)
- Reached over 785 individuals in the community through exhibiting at community events
- Educated close to 400 family members and professionals at our monthly workshops
- Hosted Special Events for over 350 participants
- Offered social and recreational opportunities for more than 350 children, youth, and adults on the autism spectrum, and
- Provided \$4145.40 in scholarships to 19 individuals/families for ASCV membership, social and recreational activities, and educational enrichment.

If you attended any of these activities or programs, or participated with us in any way, we hope that you feel your time spent was meaningful and enjoyable!
