Update on Individual and Family Support Program

Funding for the Individual and Family Support Program (IFSP) for fiscal year ending June 30, 2013 has been exhausted. **New funding will be available July 1, 2013; applications will be accepted on July 1, 2013.** Individual and Family Support Program funds may be provided to individuals or family members in varying amounts, as requested and approved by DBHDS, up to the established annual maximum individual financial support limit per fiscal year. **The fiscal year 2014 (i.e., through 6/30/14) limit is \$3,000.**

The IFSP is designed to assist individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities on the waiting list for the ID or DD Waiver (and their families) to access short-term person/family-centered resources, supports, and services.

Services and items that may be funded through the Individual and Family Support Program are intended to support the continued residence of an individual in their own or the family home and may include:

- Professionally provided services and supports, such as respite, transportation services, behavioral consultation, and behavior management;
- Assistive technology and home modifications, goods, or products that directly support the individual;
- Temporary rental assistance or deposits;
- Fees for summer camp and other recreation services;
- Temporary assistance with utilities or deposits;
- Dental or medical expenses of the individual;
- Family education, information, and training;
- Peer mentoring and family-to-family supports;
- Emergency assistance and crisis support; or
- Other direct support services as approved by DBHDS.

May 17 Monthly Meeting Diploma Options & New Credit Accommodations for Students w/ Disabilities

Learn how diploma options have changed for students with disabilities beginning ninth grade and younger in the Fall of 2013 and what this means for your child. Our speaker will be Samantha Marsh Hollins, Director of the Office of Special Education Program Improvement with the Virginia Department of Education

The 2012 General Assembly amended the *Code of VA* to emphasize college and workplace readiness for ALL students — including students with disabilities. The legislation eliminated the Modified Standard Diploma, effective with students entering the ninth grade for the first time in 2013-2014. The General Assembly also directed the Board of Education to make provisions for students with disabilities who previously would have been candidates for the Modified Standard Diploma. The Board of Education has issued guidance for school divisions on allowable credit accommodations. This session will provide information on credit accommodations based on state level guidance.

Samantha has previously served as the Educational Specialist for Autism, Intellectual Disabilities and Assistive Technology for the Virginia Department of Education.
