AUTISM AWARENESS AND ACCEPTANCE

Join Us in November for Special Screenings and Discussion

This month we'll be screening two short films from our library that focus on providing information to typical peers to promote awareness and acceptance of children with autism.

How Can I Be a Good Friend to Someone with Autism?, a 16 minute film designed to create awareness and answer basic questions about ASDs for elementary-aged students, features a fifth grader engaging in an instant message discussion with his aunt. Jacob wants to know more about four kids with ASDs at his school. Since his cousin has an ASD, Jacob figures his aunt might know how he can be a good friend to them.

Choosing To Be a GFF [Good Friend Forever] is a 15-minute production with positive social emotional themes for autism awareness and peer acceptance for middle school students. Symptoms of autism are explained by seven 12- to 15-year-old students with ASD in their real-life accounts. Friends and siblings of students with ASDs also lend their voices, making the video a powerful and effective anti-bullying tool.

Following the screenings, we'll have time for interactive discussion of this important topic. Parents, educators and community members are welcome to attend these screenings on November 12 at 7 p.m. or November 14 at 10 a.m. at River Road United Methodist Church, 8800 River Road, Richmond, 23229.

- Participated on VA Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS) Settlement Agreement Stakeholder Group

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
