# APRIL IS NATIONAL AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH: BECOME A MEMBER OF AUTISM SOCIETY CENTRAL VIRGINIA TODAY!

I joined the Autism Society Central VA (ASCV) almost 20 years ago when my son, Sam, was first diagnosed with autism. The incidence of autism was about 3 in 10,000. The Society was composed of about 8 - 10 parents and one grandparent and met at Children's Hospital. The chapter library was state of the art! We had the latest and greatest from TEACCH and Lovaas; the entire library fit in one small box! There were no paid staff, just a very small group of dedicated parents looking to support each other.

Today the incidence of autism is 1 in 88. The Society has 2 full time and 2 part time staff; holds monthly meetings drawing more than 100 folks at many events; has a lending library of over 600 materials; has a newsletter circulation of over 700 recipients; responds to several hundred I & R calls and e-mails each month; holds weekly social opportunities for children, youth, and adults with ASD; serves on several local and state work groups and advisory councils; and holds an annual 5K Walk/Run for Autism.

The most important benefit of involvement in the Autism Society has not changed - networking and learning from parents and individuals on the spectrum who are walking a similar journey! For my family, membership in the Autism Society is priceless for that simple reason!

### **April 4 Society Meeting**

#### **Getting to Yes:**

#### Parental / Student Rights & the School Division's Obligations in the Special Education Process

This presentation will focus on what the state and federal special education laws and regulations require from school divisions during the special education processes and what rights the parent and the student have with regard to those requirements. Specific areas to be covered include prior written notice (PWN), parental consent (including what happens if a parent agrees with only portions of a proposed IEP, or if the parent refuses to sign the newly proposed IEP or eligibility document, independent educational evaluations (IEE), progress measurement of annual IEP goals, and dispute resolution options (early resolution procedures, mediation, complaints, due process). The presentation will also explore how parents and students can build effective partnerships between themselves and the individuals involved in the special education process to ensure that the student receives a free appropriate public education (FAPE). There will be ample time for participants to ask general questions related to the special education process and the presenter will also remain available after the presentation time to answer any student specific questions in a more confidential environment.

"Hank" Millward is currently employed by the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) as the Coordinator of Complaints and Family Involvement. His duties include providing technical assistance and training on the federal and state special education laws and regulations to the citizens and school divisions. Mr. Millward is also responsible for investigating complaints filed by parents alleging that their school division failed to comply with some aspect of these laws and regulations. Additionally, Mr. Millward has been charged with the oversight of all of VDOE's activities related to family involvement.

Prior to coming to the VDOE, Mr. Millward held various positions, most notably as a special education teacher, special education director, Assistant Principal and Principal. He is a sibling, a parent, and a grandparent of individuals with a disability. He most enjoys working with students who have emotional disabilities and/or behavioral disorders.
