SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

RECREATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The Autism Society Central Virginia's Scholarship Program was developed to help children, youth, and adults on the autism spectrum participate in recreational and social activities. Examples of qualifying activities could include, but are not limited to: day camps, overnight camps, social skills groups, recreation leagues, bowling, etc. **Awards are based on financial need and funds available.** Partial scholarships may be awarded.

To be eligible for a scholarship, an individual must:

- be diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder
- reside in Metro-Richmond or a surrounding county.

A Committee will review all applications; scholarships will be awarded based upon the amount of funds available and the information provided on the application. The Scholarship Committee will consider financial limitations of the individual and/or family. Although membership in the ASCV is not required to apply for a scholarship, the Committee will give preference to those families and individuals demonstrating financial need who are ASCV members. MEMBERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

This spring, the Scholarship Committee recommended that the ASCV Board consider including annual membership dues (in cases of extreme financial need) to the ASCV Scholarship Program. The Board unanimously approved this addition at their May meeting. The goal of this scholarship is to allow individuals / families who are experiencing difficult financial times, or for whom membership would place a financial burden, to still be able to participate in ASCV member-only events.

To be eligible for a membership scholarship, an individual/family must submit a letter to the ASCV Scholarship Committee explaining:

- the need for scholarship, and
- what membership in the ASCV would mean (or means) to the individual and/or family.

Approved scholarships will be awarded for annual membership dues (\$25). Applicants may apply each year but there is no guarantee of annual renewal. Letters may be emailed to info@ascv.org, or mailed to ASCV Scholarship Committee, P.O. Box 29364, Richmond, VA 23242.

Autism Society Partners With Byrd Theatre For Sensory Friendly Movies

Watching a movie in a theater can put those on the spectrum in sensory overload. A sensory friendly movie offers a movie theater experience with a few accommodations; the sound is turned down, the lights are turned up, and movie trailers are not shown. Sensory friendly movies were first initiated by AMC theaters nationwide but, without a local AMC theater, sensory friendly movies have not been available in our community. Until now!

We are very excited to partner with the Byrd Theatre to offer a monthly sensory friendly movie experience to our community. A sensory friendly movie will be offered once a month on a Saturday or Sunday afternoon. Admission is \$1.99 per person. Popcorn, candy, soda, and water are available for purchase but those with dietary restrictions are welcome to bring their own refreshments (no ice cream or glass bottles allowed.)
