ASCV TO OFFER SIBSHOPS!!!

It gives us great pleasure to announce **Sibshops**, an exciting program just for brothers and sisters (ages 7 to 12) of children with special needs.

Beginning in January 2015, the ASCV will host bi-monthly Sibshops as an opportunity for brothers and sisters of children with developmental disabilities to obtain peer support and education in a fun recreational environment.

Sibshops acknowledge that being the brother or sister of a person with special needs is for some a good thing, for others a not-so-good thing, and for many somewhere in between. They reflect a belief that brothers and sisters have much to offer one another. The Sibshop model intersperses information and discussion activities with recreation and games (designed to be unique, off-beat, and appealing).

Sibshops are not therapy, although the effect may be therapeutic for some children. While Sibshop facilitators always keep an eye open for participants who may need additional services, the Sibshop model takes a wellness approach.

Our Sibshops are open to any sibling, ages 7-12, of a child with a special need. Registration forms and more info can be found on our website at http://ascv.org/meetings-events/sibshops/. There is a non-refundable fee of \$10 per session (\$5 for ASCV members). You can register for one or for all three of our Winter/Spring Sibshops.

January 9, 2015 ASCV Meeting Exploring Home and Community Based Medicaid Waivers

Medicaid Waivers can provide services and supports, such as respite, assistive technology, residential supports and more for children and adults with developmental disabilities to live in the community. ELIGIBILITY IS NOT BASED ON PARENTAL INCOME. During this free workshop, the following topics will be covered:

- · What services are available
- · How to decide which wavier you need
- · Who does the screening
- How to get screened
- How to appeal

Bradford Hulcher, ASCV Program Director and Medicaid Wavier Mentor, will also provide tips on ways you can advocate to end the waiting lists for Medicaid Waivers in Virginia.

The workshop will be held from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm at River Road United Methodist Church, 8800 River Road, Richmond, VA 23229. The workshop is free and open to the public; pre-registration is required at https://waiversinva.eventbrite.com. ASCV members look for an emailed invite to sign up for free childcare for this meeting.

ADVOCATING FOR THE AUTISM COMMUNITY

The ASCV works diligently to represent the voice of the autism community with local and state policymakers. We serve on many local and state work groups, committees, coalitions, and advisory councils to insure that the needs of our community are represented in conversations and decisions impacting individuals with autism and their families. We'll highlight the work of one of these groups each month.

Developmental Disabilities Advocacy Coalition

The DD Advocacy Coalition was formed about a year ago under the guidance of the Arc of VA. Composed of individual/family advocacy organizations from across the state, the Coalition meets quarterly face-to-face to stay current on issues of importance to the developmental disabilities community. Members of the Coalition include affiliates of the Arc, the Autism Society, the Down Syndrome Association and other groups. The Coalition collaborates to develop advocacy strategies to address legislative and policy issues such as Medicaid Waiver waiting lists, restraint and seclusion of children in public schools, closure of Virginia's training centers, Medicaid waiver redesign and much more.

On January 26, the DD Advocacy Coalition will sponsor DD Advocacy Day at the General Assembly! Planning is still in the works but includes a rally in the morning at the Bell Tower and visits to our local delegates and senators. The Autism Society Central VA will sponsor two vans for our members who wish to travel together to participate in the event! The vans will depart at 9am, one van from the Midlothian area and the second from River Road United Methodist Church in Henrico, with both arriving at the Capitol by 10am in time for the rally. We'll participate in events of the day, visit legislators and have lunch together. Buses will leave the Capitol at 2 p.m. to return to their points of origin. Look for an Eventbrite soon to register for this event!
