TAKE ACTION TODAY ASK GOVERNOR MCAULIFFE TO END THE WAIT FOR WAIVER SERVICES AND SUPPORTS!!

There are currently over 10,000 Virginians with intellectual/developmental disabilities, including autism, on waiver waiting lists – this is an all-time high, placing the Commonwealth near the bottom nationally in providing community services and supports to individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities.

The Autism Society Central Virginia stands with the Arc of Virginia in proposing that the Commonwealth provide 5,000 waiver slots for individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities in the upcoming biennium budget.

Time is of the essence. The Governor and state agencies are in the process of finalizing their budget proposals. Though the budget will be released on December 17, <u>decisions are being made now.</u> Current budget proposals ONLY include the minimum number of I/DD Waivers required by the agreement and 400 additional slots above that minimum.

The Governor needs to hear your story <u>now</u>; let him know that you are one of 10,000 families waiting for a waiver slot! <u>Contact the Governor today</u> with your personal story; let the Governor know how the lack of community services and supports through a waiver impacts your loved one and your family.
