From Our Executive Director

Our Advocacy Does Matter!

On February 1st, I had the honor of riding one of two Autism Society Central VA (ASCV) sponsored vans with a group of self-advocates, family members, and professionals to visit with our legislators for Developmental Disabilities (DD) Advocacy Day at the Virginia General Assembly. Once we arrived at the General Assembly and cleared the security check-point, we regrouped and traveled together to the first scheduled legislative visit with Delegate Kirk Cox. After each individual in our group introduced themselves to the Delegate, we thanked him for his sponsorship of the budget amendment that would cut the current I/DD Waiver Waiting List in half. Currently, more than 10,300 Virginians with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) are waiting for Medicaid waiver home and community based services. The passage of this amendment is crucial, as the Governor's proposed budget only includes 775 new waiver slots, which would not address the number of additional individuals who will be added to the waiting list in 2016.

Our group then split up and visited with our different legislators, sharing pictures of family members, stories, and information on proposed legislation that would make a positive difference in the lives of their constituents with I/DD, including the budget amendment proposed by Delegate Cox. We also spoke with and left information with many legislative aides, inviting them to contact the ASCV anytime they had questions or needed information about autism. As we traveled the halls of the General Assembly, we crossed paths with representatives from many other advocacy groups, including the Autism Society Northern VA, the Arc of VA, the Arc of Hanover, and the Down Syndrome Association of Greater Richmond, all of us advocating for an end to the wait for A Life Like Yours (ALLY) for individuals with I/DD.

When you receive this newsletter, I will have just returned from visiting with our elected officials in Washington, D.C. at the National *Day on the Hill* with staff from the Autism Society's national office and representatives from other Autism Society Affiliates from across the United States. We will have met with individual state legislators and our nation's key leaders to advocate for legislation to improve the lives of the millions impacted by autism spectrum disorder across this country every day. The *Day on the Hill* provides a unique opportunity to raise awareness among these leaders and key influencers about the work we do and the issues affecting the communities we serve. I am, as always, honored to represent the ASCV on these visits, and to share information on behalf of individuals and families in Central VA.

Thanks to ALL who traveled with the ASCV, or joined us at the Capitol, and to the many other advocacy organizations involved in the 2016 DD Advocacy Day. Our Advocacy Does Make A Difference!

ASCV RECREATIONAL AND SOCIAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS!

The Autism Society Central Virginia's Recreational and Social Scholarship Program was developed to help children, youth, and adults on the autism spectrum participate in recreational and social activities. Awards are based on financial need and funds available.

To be eligible for this scholarship, an individual must:

- 1. be diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder
- 2. reside in Metro-Richmond or a surrounding county.

A Committee will review all applications; scholarships will be awarded based upon the amount of funds available and the information provided on the application. The Scholarship Committee will consider financial limitations of the individual and/or family. Although membership in the ASCV is not required to apply for a scholarship, the Committee will give preference to those families and individuals demonstrating financial need who are ASCV members. REGISTRATION OPEN FOR I'M DETERMINED YOUTH SUMMIT!

The Virginia Department of Education's **I'm Determined** project, in conjunction with the Partnership for People with Disabilities, invites applications for sponsorship to the 10th Annual I'm Determined Youth and Parent Summit at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Virginia.

Youth with disabilities, ages 13 - 21, from across the Commonwealth will meet to identify ways to become better advocates and lead more self-determined lives. The selected individuals and a parent/guardian will receive paid registration, dormitory accommodations, travel expenses and meals for the three-day event. A concurrent Parent Summit for the selected participant's parent/guardian will also be held at the university. Parents do not apply separately.
