APRIL IS NATIONAL AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH JOIN US FOR OUR 2nd ANNUAL CENTRAL VA AUTISM CONFERENCE!

The greatest benefit of involvement with the Autism Society Central VA will always be our community - networking and learning from parents and individuals on the spectrum who are walking a similar path! On April 16th, our Second Annual Autism Conference, *Autism in the Family: Families & Professionals Caring & Coping Together*, will offer the opportunity to learn from a very special parent, psychologist, author, and speaker.

Dr. Robert Naseef, has been part of the autism community since 1981 when his son was first identified. He became a typical father in 1979. It was a dream come true—those magical first smiles, first steps, first words. Then in 1981, his son stopped talking, stopped playing normally, and began flapping his arms. From those first red flags of autism until now, autism has become the central theme of his life and work, and he shares his expertise through counseling, speaking, teaching, and writing about the impact of autism on families.

Dr. Naseef will present a free preconference session for "dads only" on Friday evening, April 15th (see page 4 for details.) On Saturday morning, April 16th, his keynote, *Being Present: The Family Journey to Acceptance and Resilience*, will inspire and energize family members and professionals. Dr. Naseef will then continue to share information on the following topics during breakouts sessions:

- Special Children, Challenged Parents, Caring Professionals: Building Partnerships
- Understanding and Guiding Your Child's Behavior
- The conference will conclude with a panel presentation of fathers and sons on the spectrum, facilitated by Dr. Naseef.

A resource fair will be open throughout the day.

To be eligible for this scholarship, an individual must:

- 1. be diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder
- 2. reside in Metro-Richmond or a surrounding county.
