Into the Light

WAIVER REDESIGN TO BE IMPLEMENTED JULY 1, 2016 WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) and Department of Behavioral Health Developmental Services (DBHDS) have spent the past two years engaging the expertise of consultants, as well as stakeholders across the state, to redesign Virginia's Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) waivers for individuals with intellectual and other developmental disabilities.

Beginning July 1, waiver redesign will offer new waivers with new services. All three amended waivers will serve individuals with a diagnosis of Developmental Disability (which includes Intellectual Disability).

Those currently receiving services through the Day Support Waiver will transition to the **Building Independence Waiver**. This waiver is for adults (18+) who are able to live independently in the community.

Those currently receiving the DD Waiver will transition to the **Family & Individual Supports Waiver**. This waiver is for individuals living with their families, friends, or in their own homes.

Those currently receiving the ID Waiver will transition to the **Community Living Waiver**, which offers 24/7 licensed services and supports for individuals with complex medical and/or behavioral support needs.

The EDCD Waiver will not be impacted by the Waiver Redesign.



The first 200 people on the current chronological DD Waiver waiting list will receive the new Family & Individual Supports Waiver on July 1. Everyone else on the current ID and DD waiver waiting lists will transition to one statewide waiting list and be informed of their priority level by their case managers.

Over the coming months, the ASCV newsletter will contain additional information on waiver changes and reform. We also anticipate offering workshops on the new waivers next fall. 
