A Brain in Your Pocket: Mobile Devices as Aids to Independent Living

Professor Tony Gentry, the director of Virginia Commonwealth University's Assistive Technology for Cognition Laboratory, will discuss strategies for using mobile technologies for time and task management, task-sequencing, way-finding, behavioral adaptation, augmented communication and video modeling, based on the results of a series of community-based trials with populations including students and young adults with autism and brain injury. Smartphones, personal digital assistants, and tablets can be powerful assistive technologies for people with cognitive-behavioral challenges. Portable, versatile, and easily configured with appropriate apps, these devices can be used to address everyday problems at home, work, school and in the community. Attendees will be provided with a catalog of tried-and-true mobile apps, and links to instructional materials for further learning. The target audience for this presentation is parents, care givers, educators, and providers.

ABLEnow VIRGINIA'S TAX-ADVANTAGED SAVINGS PROGRAM FOR QUALIFIED DISABILITY EXPENSES

ABLEnow is a national ABLE (Achieving a Better Life Experience) program administered by Virginia529, the country's largest college savings plan. Enrollment is expected to begin in late 2016.

Who is eligible?

An eligible individual is someone who developed the onset of their disability before age 26, and:

- is receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) disability benefits, or
- self-certifies that they have a qualifying disability diagnosis from a physician, and
- the individual must have been living with their disability for at least one year, or they must expect their disability to last for at least a year.

What are the benefits?

- Flexible – Pay for current expenses and save for those in the future. It's easy to open, manage and contribute to an ABLEnow account.
- Tax-Advantaged - Earnings grow free from federal taxes when used to pay for qualified expenses. In addition, some states offer state tax incentives. For example, Virginia offers an annual state income tax deduction of up to \$2,000 per contributor for contributions to an ABLEnow account.
- Protect Disability Benefits - ABLE accounts do not affect eligibility for Medicaid. Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is not affected as long as your ABLE account balance is less than \$100,000 and you spend withdrawals for housing expenses within the same calendar month as you withdraw the money.

WAIVER REDESIGN UPDATE

The federal Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has approved Virginia's Waiver redesign for implementation. This affects the ID, DD, and Day Support Waivers. Those waivers will now be called the Community Living (CL), the Family and Individual Support (FIS), and the Building Independence (BI) Waivers, respectively. The approved implementation date is September 1. There will be much more information coming from DBHDS and DMAS regarding the schedule and implementation steps over the next few weeks.

VIRGINIA LIFESPAN RESPITE VOUCHER PROGRAM

The Virginia Lifespan Respite Voucher Program was created to provide reimbursement vouchers to home-based family caregivers for the cost of temporary, short-term respite care provided to their family members with disabilities (children and adults, including elderly persons). You must be a Virginia caregiver of a child or children, or an adult or adults, who reside full-time in your household. You may receive up to \$400 in vouchers per family per year. The primary caregiver for the person receiving care must apply for the funds. You may not use voucher funds to reimburse household expenses or daycare; for example, so that the caregiver can go to work. You may be eligible, but funds are limited. Not everyone who applies will be approved. A new funding cycle opens Aug. 1. Learn more at <http://www.vda.virginia.gov/respiteservices.asp>
