From Our Executive Director

SUMMERTIME, AND THE LIVING IS EASY?? MAYBE THESE TIPS WILL HELP

Along with the hot weather and bugs, summertime often brings a sense of the unknown to individuals with autism and families. If you have a son or daughter who struggles with the summer months, misses the routine that school provides, or just prefers to know what is coming next, here are some ideas to hopefully make the summer months easier. If you have additional ideas to share, please email them to info@ascv.org and we will do our best to pass them on as well!

Tips for the summer:

- Create a schedule for each day similar to the one your son or daughter has during the school year, to help them know what to expect. For pre-readers, pictures are often best. There are a variety of schedule apps available for the iPad, Kindle Fire, and phones. You can also go "old school" and use a plain paper schedule or calendar.
- 2. Have a backpack with you always that has favored food, a change of clothes, and comfort objects. Don't forget a spare cable/cord to recharge electronics, ear protection, bug spray, and sunscreen.
- 3. Even fun things like a trip to the zoo can be stressful. Use photos and Social Stories to help prepare for outings and vacations. If you want to learn more about how to use Social Stories, check out this website -- www.carolgraysocialstories.com.
- 4. Remember to take things slow and follow your child's lead. Have a plan "B" and try not to be upset if you have to leave activities and events quickly.
- 5. Many individuals are drawn to water. Summer is a good time to teach swimming and water safety. If your child is not experiencing success in a regular swim class, talk to the instructor about options. Some clubs and YMCAs in our area also offer individual swim lessons.
- 6. Doing things for the first time can provoke fear and anxiety in everyone. Plan for some new things, but also have familiar favorite activities sprinkled through the schedule.
- 7. Nurture and encourage areas of interest and your child's strengths. Research and build excitement for vacations by including everyone in the plans.
- 8. Check for what is offered at your local public library and school or county recreation program. Offer to attend with your child or send a caregiver or attendant along if they will need a higher level of support than the program provides.


CHECK OUT THIS NEW VDOE WEBSITE – THE VIRGINIA FAMILY SPECIAL EDUCATION CONNECTION
