Into the Light

THE ABCs OF BEHAVIOR SEPTEMBER 8, 2017

Most individuals with autism will display challenging behaviors at some point in their lives. Sometimes these behaviors are quite difficult to understand and address. When supporting people with autism and challenging behavior, it's critical to understand the "ABCs" of behavior. Just as the ABCs of the alphabet are the beginning of learning to read and write, learning the ABCs (Antecedent-Behavior-Consequence) of behavior is the starting point of assessing and addressing challenging behavior and teaching new, desirable behavior. This training will explain these concepts and provide data collection tips and practical examples. This workshop is intended for parents/guardians of individuals with developmental disabilities, providers, and/or educators.



Presenter: V.J. Petillo

V.J. Petillo is an Endorsed Positive Behavior Support Facilitator. He is currently a community Behavioral Consultant and Trainer, and the Behavior Specialist for REACH Region IV. In this role, V.J. is involved in the clinical assessment, support planning, and training offered through REACH services. V.J.'s experiences in the field of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities date back to 1991, when he started working in a group home in Ohio. Since that time, he's worked in a wide variety of service settings, including: residential services, supported employment, exceptional education, case management, private practice as a behavioral consultant, and crisis supports. A significant part of V.J.'s work throughout his career has involved directly providing and/or developing behavioral supports. V. J. has a Master's Degree in Rehabilitation Counseling and a Master's Degree in Theology. He was endorsed as a Positive Behavior Support Facilitator in Virginia in 2006.

Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus Waiver Replaces EDCD and Tech Waivers

Waivers provide long-term services and supports in the home and community for eligible individuals. On July 1, 2017, the Commonwealth Coordinated Plus (CCC+) Waiver replaced the waivers formerly known as the Elderly or Disabled with Consumer Direction (EDCD) Waiver and the Technology (Tech) Waiver. This occurred for everyone statewide who was on an EDCD or Tech waiver.



The good news is that new services may be available to you under this new waiver. Individuals on the former EDCD waiver may now be eligible for Assistive Technology (AT) or Environmental Modifications (EM) with service limits of \$5,000 for each service. Also new in this waiver is that all long-term care (waiver) services will now be managed through a managed care program called Commonwealth Coordinated Care. The CCC Plus Waiver is for:

- adults 65+ with a medical or nursing need
- individuals less than 65 years old with a disability and a medical or nursing need.

Some individuals with autism may qualify for this waiver. Currently there is no waiting list for the CCC Plus Waiver. Contact the ASCV at info@ascv.org for additional information on screening for this waiver.

Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus Medicaid Managed Care

Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus (CCC Plus) is a new statewide Medicaid managed care program that will serve individuals with complex care needs currently receiving Medicaid. CCC Plus will include many people with disabilities on Medicaid, but not all. The CCC Plus managed care program will start in different parts of the state at different times; in the Richmond area, this will occur September 1, 2017. Qualifying individuals in the Richmond area received notification and information about this change at the beginning of August.

If you are enrolled in the CCC Plus managed care program, your CCC Plus Waiver services and your Medicaid medical services will be administered by your managed care company.

If you receive supports through one of the Developmental Disabilities Waivers, your waiver services **will not** be impacted by any of these CCC plus changes. However, your Medicaid medical services may be administered by one of the CCC plus managed care organizations/health care plans. IFSP Funding Application Opens October 3, 2017



The Individual and Family Support (IFSP) Funding Program provides funds for services, supports, and items for individuals with developmental disabilities that enhance or improve the quality of life and promote independence and community-based living. Individuals who are on the waitlist for the DD Waiver may apply for IFSP funding.

DBHDS released information about the FY 2018 IFSP Funding on the IFSP website on August 17th. The FY 2018 application must be submitted online. This means no more paper!

The application will be available online sometime before October 3rd. You will be able to review the application, fill in your information, edit and make changes, and save a draft copy. **You will not be able to submit your application before 9 am on October 3, 2017.**

Please be sure to check the IFSP website for instructions, deadlines, and program guidelines. All application information will be posted on the IFSP http://www.dbhds.virginia.gov/individuals-and-families/developmental-disabilities/community-support-services.


