Teams are the heart of the 5K Run/Walk for Autism! Over 70 teams participated in last year's 5K and we are looking forward to new teams joining us this year.

Forming a team is a great way to encourage family and friends to participate in the event. Many families form teams to honor their loved ones with autism, while others form a group based on a place of work, club or civic organization.

Teams also participate in "friendly competition" as they vie for the annual trophy awards of largest team, highest fundraising by a team and the Don Mayfield Spirit award.

This year we are adding four additional team trophies: largest school team, highest fundraising by a school team, largest business/organization team, and highest fundraising by a business or organization.

The easiest way to form a team is by registering online. You will be guided through the process as you register. 2018 I'm Determined Youth and Parent Summit Application Now Open

The I'm Determined Youth and Parent Summit is a two-day event held each June and sponsored by the Virginia Department of Education and the Partnership for People with Disabilities. Youth with disabilities from across the Commonwealth meet to network and discuss issues of importance to youth and young adults with disabilities. The Summit is open to Virginia youth with disabilities ages 13-21 and their parent(s).

The 2018 Summit will be held on June 13-15 at James Madison University. Housing, food, and transportation costs are covered for those accepted to participate.

Make a Difference – Let Your Voice Be Heard

Virginia lawmakers came together for the 2018 legislative session on January 10th and will meet until March 10th. You can make a difference in the decisions they make! Contact your legislators and let them know how their decisions impact you and your family.

The ASCV is supporting the 2018 legislative agenda of the DD Coalition and the ARC of VA:

Funding slots for Priority 1 of the DD Waitlist over 2 years - Currently there are 12,000 people waiting to receive waiver services in VA. 1 in 4 of those people are on the URGENT (Priority 1) Waitlist. The Governor's budget included 875 waivers. We are asking for 2000+ additional waivers in order to fund all of the Priority 1 Waitlist. (Budget Amendment Items 303#12s and 303#1h)

Supporting Inclusive Education - We are asking to direct VDOE to work with two public school divisions in a pilot program of inclusive education. (HB 176 and SB 975)

The ASCV is also supporting this legislation:

Supporting Autism Insurance Coverage - This legislation would require health insurers, health care subscription plans, and HMOs to provide coverage for the diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorder in individuals of any age. Currently, such coverage is required to be provided for individuals from age two through age 10. (HB1311 and SB593)

Note SB593 has been amended in the Senate to have an age cap of age 18.

Your legislators make their decisions based on what they hear from their constituents. Our voices together can make a difference for the futures of individuals with autism and our families.

The Youth Leadership Academy, formerly known as the Youth Leadership Forum, is a training program held by the Virginia Board for People with Disabilities that seeks to empower youth with disabilities to further develop and demonstrate their leadership skills. Students participate in a wide range of personal, professional and career development activities, social skills enhancement, small group exploration, and interact with enthusiastic peers and successful role models while on the campus of Virginia State University.

To be eligible youth must:

- Have a developmental or other disability
- Be a rising high school sophomore, junior, or senior as of December 2017
- Have demonstrated leadership potential
- Reside in Virginia
