VCU's Center on Transition Innovations is offering an online class for high school students in grades 9-12 who are interested in attending college and want to learn more about the skills necessary to be successful. The online course, "Get Ready for College: A Resource for Teens with Disabilities" is a free series of online lessons that provide the students with knowledge such as college preparation, selection and the disability services process.

The course includes video presentations and resources that help students prepare for the next steps to college life. Important topics include the difference between high school and college, finding the college with the best fit, getting accommodations in college and how to prepare for college while still in high school. The course is self-paced and will take students approximately 20 hours to complete.



FAMILY COUNSELING

Family counseling aims to build communication, collaboration, understanding and problem-solving skills within the family unit. Family members can gain a greater understanding of their role and how that can impact others in a positive or negative way. Family counseling includes a systems assessment of your family to identify treatment goals and objectives. Family counseling can be a powerful tool in overcoming a multitude of issues including parenting issues, martial concerns, domestic violence, financial stress, illness of a loved one and other major life changes.

OCOUPLES

Couples counseling provides a forum where communication and conflict resolution skills can be developed within the context of your relationship. Couples counseling aims to build a greater sense of understanding of yourself and your partner to improve the overall health of your relationship. Treatment includes an initial intake evaluation and weekly 55-60 minute sessions.

SOCIAL SKILLS GROUPS

Children, teens and adults with poor socialization skills are less likely to form healthy intimate relationships, more likely to experience rejection, and have a higher likelihood of running into trouble either with the juvenile or adult legal system.

Academic performance is also impacted, because students who have a hard time connecting with peers develop self-esteem issues, depression, social anxiety and apathy toward those around them, which makes students less likely to focus their energy on academic achievement. Some of the most important social skills for individuals to learn are conflict resolution, understanding and forming friendships, valuing other people and their ideas, taking turns, understanding body language, improving eye contact and taking responsibility for their own actions.

Developing strong social skills can also help build self-esteem, confidence and assertiveness. Strong social skills build resilience which increase your ability to deal with social stressors such as bullying and other conflicts.

Social Skills Groups are also a powerful tool in the treatment of children, teens and adults with ADHD, Autism and other development concerns.

OHOW TO JOIN A GROUP

Before joining a group you must contact us to schedule and intake evaluation. During the initial appointment we will identify your needs and match you to a group that will be the best fit for you or your child. Groups are covered by some insurance companies. Groups meet weekly for 55-60 minutes. For children and teens ongoing parent meetings are required throughout treatment to reinforce skills, monitor progress and identify areas of continued concern.

RESILIENCE GROUPS

Building resilience skills can empower you to take control of your thoughts, outlook and perspective on any obstacles you may be facing. Resilience is the ability to overcome the many challenges we all face in life. The main reason one individual is more resilient than another is not intelligence, genetics, biological factors, life circumstance or situations; it's the way you think and respond. Resilience Groups provide a unique forum for children, teens and adults to develop supportive peer relationships while learning resilience skills in an engaging and interactive format. Resilience Groups aim to build the following skills:

- Learn how your thoughts matter and take more control of them
- Transform negative self-talk
- Enhance problem solving skills
- Learn about and develop your personal character strengths
- Develop a growth mindset, rather than a fixed one
- Increase confidence and self-esteem
- Set goals and achieve them
- Learn to adapt and overcome rather than accepting defeating thoughts

COUNSELING SERVICES

OINDIVIDUAL COUNSELING

Individual counseling can be useful to address a variety of concerns such as depression, anxiety, stress, attention, focus and trauma. 1-1 sessions provide a private setting to focus on your individualized needs. Treatment involves the use of proven techniques including CBT, DBT, mindfulness and other strengths based interventions. Individual Counseling includes an initial evaluation and assessment, treatment plan development and weekly 55-60 minute sessions. Depending on the level of treatment required more frequent sessions may be recommended.

GROUP COUNSELING

Group counseling provides a supportive atmosphere where a variety of issues can be discussed with peers in a confidential setting. The group setting can provide additional support and foster a variety of opinions and feedback. Topics discussed may include emotional regulation, anger management, increased self-awareness and interpersonal skills. Our groups are focused on developing resiliency skills to improve your over all well-being. Groups meet weekly for 55-60 minutes and contain 3-10 group members. Joining a group requires and initial evaluation to assess your goals for treatment and match you to the group that is the best fit for you.
